14 April	Phonics: > English sounds and why spelling is confusing. Students play a matching	
	game that emphasizes inconsistencies in English spelling and try to develop strategies for pronouncing new words. Sounding out-using syllables to attack words. (This is a key skill that many students have still not mastered by secondary school.)	
	Skills: Discussions: How to start: students learn key phrases for starting group discussions.	
	 Discussions: How to respond and continue: Ss learn to offer comment and seek further responses using linking phrases. Practice discussions. 	
21 April	Phonics: Confusing sounds. Ss practice hearing the difference between sounds that cause problems for Cantonese speakers- e.g "n" and "l", terminal "d" and "t". Skills:	
	Obtaining information. Ss learn and practice correct spoken question forms and listen to record answers. These are key skills that can be applied to a range of tasks- conversation, discussion, HKCE Oral exam tasks etc.	
28 April	Phonics: More confusing sounds "a" and "e" vowel sounds, terminal "b" and "p". Skills:	
	> Debating- Ss learn the key skills for argument and discussion: presenting, listening, and summarizing / restating.	
5 May	Phonics: > Important blends- "ea", "oa" etc. and how they can be pronounced. Skills:	
	 Presenting: Just-A-Minute, a fun competitive game in which Ss have to speak without hesitation or repetition for a minute on a given topic. Organizing for presenting. Ss learn a practical structure for oral presentations and practice applying it to material. Practice presentations. 	
12 May	Phonics: Homonyms and homophones; words that sound the same but mean different things- Ss must listen carefully for context to find meaning. Skills:	
	Silent Speech: A fun activity in which T "mouths" words and the Ss attempt to record what is said- without hearing. Ss must concentrate on the way the mouth is shaped to make sounds. They can also learn to use facial expression and gesture to communicate.	
19 Ma y	Phonics:	
	Skills: ➤ Tongue Twisters: Ss learn and practice traditional tongue-twisting rhymes and challenge each other to repeat them in a short time.	
26 May	 Phonics: Review of syllable strategies and confusing sounds. Mini-test. Fun listening activity to complete course and boost self-esteem. Skills: 	
	 Storytelling (a useful social skill, good for meeting new people and practicing expressing one's own personality in the new language. Ss have a "tall story competition" in which they mix truth with fiction and try to tell the difference. 	
2 June	Field trip proposals: > A press conference > A Legco session	
	A visit to an ESF school for a shared activity- debating, storytelling; or perhaps an active game session where Ss use English to teach a new game to other Ss and then play it.

14 April	Phonics: ➤ Sentence stress: Ss practice changing and understanding the meaning of sentences by varying the stress pattern. Skills: ➤ Instructing: Ss will READ to learn a new skill. They will then prepare a presentation to teach the skill to the class.
21 April	 Phonics: Vocal effects: Ss learn to use their voice tone and volume to strengthen meaning in their speaking. Skills: Narrating: Ss will learn a story from an oral tradition, and practice telling the story, using their voices for dramatic effect, and
	enriching their language to create vivid images.
28 April	 Phonics: Intonation with questions. Ss practice producing and hearing the difference between open questions (voice stays flat at the end) and yes/no questions (voice rises) Skills: Reaching agreement: Ss will learn language and strategies for team work and co-operation.
5 May	Phonics:
12 May	 More on sentence stress and intonation- adding meaning and demonstrating comprehension using voice tone. Skills: Reaching agreement 2: Ss will continue practicing how to use English in working in groups.
12 May	 Working with confusing English sounds: Ss use the Radio Alphabet (Alpha, Bravo, Charlie) to spell out words, then invent their own. Skills: Emergency English: Drawing on the previous lessons, Ss will use speaking skills to respond to an emergency, including: telling what has happened, co-operating to find a solution, and teaching others how to respond to the situation.
19 May	Phonics: More confusing sounds-"th" and "f". Skills: Telling jokes: Ss learn to deliver jokes using vocal effects and timing.
26 May	 Phonics: Homonyms and homophones: words that sound the same but mean different things- Ss must listen carefully for context to find meaning. Skills: Rhyming Riddles: Ss listen to a passage from "The Hobbit" by JRR Tolkien, then make up their own riddles and have a riddling competition.
2 June	Role play: Ss will work in groups to produce a dramatic presentation, trying to put all their skills into practice. We can video this and base their final assessment on this performance.
